Holiday Homework

1. Choose your theme Due - Week 1

In Week 1, you will need to discuss your chosen theme/ concept and begin development and exploration. By Week 4 you will have submitted your *Exploration Proposal* draft. This document, along with a work plan, outlines what you wish to explore and how you propose to do it. Exploration is a major focus of Unit 3. The Studio Process involves exploring ideas, materials and techniques to discover the most effective ways to communicate your ideas.

To choose a theme you need to be inspired. <u>Brainstorm</u> and create a <u>Mindmap</u> about things you would like to explore. This could include: things you feel passionately about or strongly connect to, political stances, materials or techniques you want to experiment with, art elements/principles like colour or movement, things you are worried about or would love to champion, something personal or public. Over the break consider which idea/s you are most drawn to. Do some <u>browsing</u> into this idea/ theme, see if there is any <u>related art or artists</u> that inspire you. <u>Collect this inspiration in a folder (physical or digital)</u>. You will find that a good theme/ concept gets you more excited the more you look into it.

You need to know your theme by Week 1 because the Year 12 academic year is actually quite short. It begins late Jan and after two weeks of Term 4, official classes are finished, all coursework is submitted.

You should approach choosing a theme/ concept the same way you approach anything – creatively! There are heaps of websites and exhibitions out there but your ideas will be shaped by the ones that you connect with. Of course, movies, art magazines, libraries and book shops, music and poetry, actually taking photographs or making collages, observing and imagining is a great way to get inspired. 2. Develop your Visual Diary Due - Review Week 2

You will be documenting your individual studio practice in a visual diary. This includes all exploration and development of ideas, sources of inspiration, materials, techniques and methods of presentation. You need to begin this exploration over the term break. Even though you may not have a visual diary, you can still collect loose pages of ideas, sketches, poetry, photos, musings, images, exhibition flyers, concert tickets, found objects (etc) to insert. Go to galleries, watch movies, browse art books in bookshops and libraries...

You can start taking photographs over the summer break. It's an ideal time to take photos without the pressure of school but remember to make some notes about when, where, what, how and why?

3. Select 2 artists to research Due - Week 2

You need to select 2 photographers from different historical or cultural contexts (different time periods). You will be comparing their studio practice and analysing two artworks by each artist. It is 100% absolutely imperative that you only select artists whose work and life has been heavily documented, as you will need to discuss the historical and cultural influences on their work.

On the Exploration Proposal - You will prepare an exploration proposal at the start of the year that formulates your theme/ideas, intentions, individual studio process, possible techniques, materials and aesthetics to be explored, and a work plan detailing how this will be achieved. The Exploration Proposal is an integral document that guides the development of your work and is a reference point for reflection and analysis throughout the year.

The Exploration Proposal will include:

- Chosen theme/ focus including personal motivations as to why you are interested in this theme
- Ideas and conceptual possibilities to be explored
- Sources of inspiration/ artistic influences ٠
- Aesthetic qualities to be explored in the studio process, reference to art elements & principles •
- Art form/s to be explored i.e. Digital Photography, silver gelatin photography, drawing, installation, mixed media
- Exploration of materials, techniques & processes, i.e. darkroom processes, digital editing techniques, lighting techniques
- A Work plan that acts as a timeline for your exploratory studio process


