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Work required in preparation for start of 2019:

- > What is important to me?
- > Would I be better suited to TAFE or university?
- > Do I want to study interstate?
- > Would I be interested in an apprenticeship?
- > What if I worked for a year and then studied?
- > Is there a particular course I have been thinking about doing?

While exploring these questions and possible pathways, for those considering going on to further education, don't think about whether you will get the ATAR you need for a particular course or whether you will have the prerequisites required. There are so many pathways one can take to achieve their desired outcome, so it is important at this stage, to reach for the stars and not be limited in your thoughts by what you think you can achieve.
