

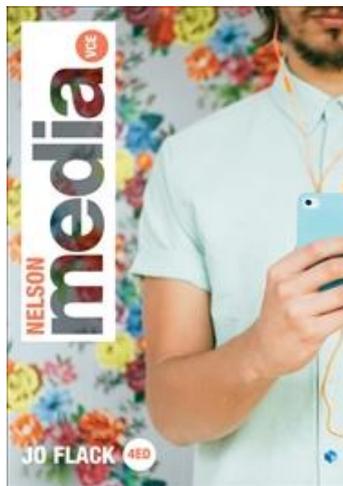

Development:

Step 1:

Read the below information and decide which media form you would like to work in for 2019 (e.g. moving image, still image, sound).

Step 2:

Use the following triangular graphic organisers to hone in on the product you wish to create. Write in the centre of each triangle the form and product name before adding three media products in the surrounding triangles that best sum your concept up.

Step 3:

Finally, create a Word Document to write out each of your three concepts as short blurbs no longer than 100 words in length ready to pitch on the first day back from the holidays.

The School Assessed Task

You will produce a media product including audio, visual and/or text components as appropriate in the following forms:

Product and scope of task

- a video or film sequence 3–10 minutes in length, including title and credit sequences
 - an animated production of no more than 10 minutes in length, including title and credit sequences
 - a radio or audio production of a minimum of 8 minutes in length, including title and credit sequences
 - a photographic presentation, sequence or series of images that incorporates a minimum of 10 original source images that must be processed and edited by the student
 - a digital or print production of a minimum of 8 pages or layouts produced and edited by the student
 - a digital and/or online production that demonstrates comparable complexity and provides user accessibility consistent with other media forms
 - a convergent or hybridized media production that incorporate aspects of a range of media forms and is consistent with product durations and/or descriptors listed.
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The production of the media product is undertaken individually. However, the implementation of the production design plan may, in some audio and audiovisual productions, require the collaboration of others to realise the student's intentions as developed in the media production design. Group production work and group media production design plans are not appropriate.

While students may incorporate pre-existing material in media productions, the use of such material may detract from the student's capacity to develop an individual and/or distinctive product and may not allow a student the opportunity to fully demonstrate management and organisational skills. Therefore, students need to be aware of the implications of including such material in their work.

You should make yourself familiar with the relevant conditions and restrictions of the *Copyright Act 1968* in relation to the use of professionally produced music, sounds and images in student productions. Students will document their process, changes to their production design and records of iterations of their production in their design which will be submitted twice: once to satisfy the requirements of Unit 3 and again when the final production is submitted in Unit 4. This documentation will be assessed as part of the production.
