Parent Payment Arrangements 2021

Parent contributions, in all forms, support Swinburne Senior Secondary College in providing a curriculum that is relevant, challenging and comprehensive.

Students enjoy first class facilities that provide an exceptional young adult learning environment, enabling students to focus their learning around their values, attitudes and needs. The College has been identified by the Victorian Qualification Authority as a centre for excellence in the Arts and the exemplary learning spaces in the visual and performing arts and in design and technology are powerful inducements to prospective students.

Swinburne is large enough to offer a broad range of programs, yet also of a size where individual needs can be accommodated and the welfare of students can be ensured. The College offers a comprehensive mentor program, which provides support and guidance to all students and our Careers and Pathways Adviser provides programs to assist students in setting and achieving goals for learning and employment.

The Department of Education and Training provides funding that only covers the basic curriculum. In order to provide the facilities and programs as mentioned above and a framework that continuously improves student learning and outcomes, the College requires your financial support. There are three fee categories:

- 1. Essential Student Learning Items;
- 2. Optional Items; and
- 3. Voluntary Financial Contributions.

Essential Student Learning Items

Essential Student Learning Items are items and activities which the College deems as essential for student learning, without which, students would be unable to access the standard curriculum.

Optional Items

Swinburne Senior Secondary College offers optional items and activities that are additional to the delivery of the standard curriculum. These items and activities are designed to broaden the school experience for your child and are provided on a user-pays basis. Notification of activities and associated costs for 2021 will be advised as they arise.

Voluntary Contributions

Swinburne Senior Secondary College Council is extremely appreciative of the generosity of parents who are able to support the College through voluntary contributions as these are much needed to cover essential running costs.

The College Fund forms an important part of basic budgetary requirements of the College ensuring the provision of careers' resources, mentoring programs, library resources (magazines/subscriptions), College buses, Compass (school management platform), ICT support/technology and classroom equipment to support learning outcomes for all students.

Financial support for the Library and Building Funds (both of which are tax deductible) enable the upgrade and maintenance of buildings and grounds and library resources. In 2021, contributions will be put towards the refurbishment of the Library and the Student Services Hub.

Financial support for the Music Fund will go towards the purchase of musical instruments.

Product Design Fashion / Studio Arts - Textiles

Includes patterns, fabric, clothing, clothes dye, cotton, zippers, needles, pins, bias binding, velcro, tailor's chalk, elastic, buttons, lining, ink, fasteners, pencils, fabric scissors, hand sewing kits

Product Design Jewellery

Includes beads, gemstones, other jewels, ca=raft wire, pliers, badges, string, adhesive, enamel, metal spoons

Product Design Wood

Includes furniture polish, oils, adhesive, tape, paint, screw, nails, safety face protectors, dust masks, sponges, masonite, sandpaper, tape measures, fasteners, cords, timber, clock movement parts

Product Design Industrial

Includes colour pencils, circle templates, gel pens, timber, hubcaps, plastic, quartz clock parts, storage boxes, sandpaper, welding eye shields, fasteners, adhesive, stanley knives, tape measures, hand cleaner, face protectors, engraving kits, rope, dust masks, jigsaw blades, masonite, tape, concrete, paper

Studio Arts Photography

Includes photographic chemicals, photographic paper, film, fabric, specialised paper, batteries, labels, texts, foam board, window mounts, glue sticks, visual diary

Theatre Studies

Includes make up

Visual Communication

Includes specialised paper, markers, corrugated cart, foam, model making kits, masking tape, glue sticks, rulers, coloured pencils, paint brushes, balsa wood, box board, figurines, wooden boxes, foam blades, A3 pockets, circle templates, stickers, containers, workbooks
